

COVID-19 Vaccine Myths vs Facts

With so much misinformation surrounding COVID-19 vaccines, you may have some questions, and that's good. It's normal to be cautious when something new comes along. Wanting to know more is a good thing — it means you want to be informed. Below are common myths and facts surrounding COVID-19 vaccines.

X MYTH:

COVID-19 vaccines can give you the virus.



COVID-19 vaccines do not give you the virus and do not include the live virus. The vaccines provide critical information to cells in our bodies to help fight the virus and build resistance to it if you are exposed to COVID-19 in the future.



The COVID-19 vaccine will alter my DNA.



Vaccines do not affect or interact with your DNA.

I do not have to wear a mask or practice social distancing once I'm vaccinated.



The vaccine helps prevent you from getting sick with COVID-19, but it is not currently known if it prevents you from transmitting the virus to others. Stopping the pandemic requires using all the tools available like wearing a mask, washing your hands and social distancing.

I can't afford getting a vaccine for



The COVID-19 vaccine is free for all residents, regardless of insurance coverage or citizenship status.

I'm young and healthy, I won't get sick from COVID-19.



While COVID-19 disproportionately impacts minorities, senior citizens and individuals with underlying conditions, it can make you sick regardless of age, ethnicity/race or fitness level. The vaccine will help strengthen your body's ability to resist infection.



COVID-19 vaccines were rushed and are



Vaccine safety standards were not compromised to expedite development and distribution. Robust clinical trials and safety reviews were conducted and show that the vaccines prevent infection, or serious illness from the virus, in up to 95% of vaccine trial recipients.

I cannot get the COVID-19 vaccine if I'm pregnant or breastfeeding.

You are not excluded from getting the vaccine, but public health officials may request that you observe extra precautions after receiving the vaccine. You should consult a health care professional if you have questions.

Currently, experts do not know how long someone is protected from getting sick again after recovering from COVID-19, and re-infection is possible. We won't know how long immunity produced by vaccination lasts until we have more data on how well the vaccines work.






There are no tracking devices or microchips in the vaccines.

FDA Approves First COVID-19 Vaccine (Pfizer)

and Authorizes a third dose of Pfizer or Moderna for Moderate and Severely immunocompromised individuals

THIRD DOSE

WHO? People who are moderately to severely immunocompromised are recommended to get a third dose of an mRNA COVID-19 vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna).

WHAT? A third dose of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine is recommended for immunocompromised individuals to have the full benefit of the vaccine series. This is NOT considered a booster.

WHEN? The third dose should be given no sooner than 28 days after the initial two-dose mRNA COVID-19 vaccine series.


WHERE? Find a vaccine near you at www.vaccines.gov.

WHY? People with compromised immune systems may not build the same level of immunity to 2-dose vaccine series compared to people who are not immunocompromised, and they may benefit from an additional dose to make sure they have enough protection against COVID-19.

The third dose of an mRNA COVID-19 vaccine should be the same vaccine brand as the initial series and administered at least four weeks or 28 days after completing a primary mRNA COVID-19 vaccine series.

Who is considered immunocompromised & recommended to get an additional dose of mRNA COVID-19 vaccine?

- Receiving active cancer treatment for tumors or cancers of the blood
- Received an organ transplant & are taking medicine to suppress the immune system
- Received a stem cell transplant within the last 2 years or are taking medicine to suppress the immune system
- Moderate or severe primary immunodeficiency (such as DiGeorge syndrome, Wiskott-Aldrich syndrome)
- Advanced or untreated HIV infection
- Active treatment with high-dose corticosteroids or other drugs that may suppress your immune response



Flu Vaccine

Cavalier County Health District recommends all individuals 6 months of age and older receive an influenza vaccine this season to prevent getting the flu. Influenza is an illness characterized by fever, body aches, cough and sore throat, not the "stomach flu" people often think of. Influenza illness can be particularly severe in the very young, very old, or individuals with other health conditions like heart disease, lung disease, and diabetes. It is important to get vaccinated to protect not just yourself but those around you. Cavalier County Health District is able to bill most insurances and has influenza vaccine at no cost for children and adults (limited doses available for uninsured adults) not covered by insurance.


Great Opportunities for Youth
